Dear Girls Prep Families,

I cannot believe in a few short hours we will be welcoming all our scholars back to school and launching the 22-23 school year! We had a fantastic day with new scholars today and are eager to see their classmates in the morning. Here is what to expect at arrival and dismissal tomorrow:

- 5th and 6th graders-- enter through the Courtyard
- 7th and 8th graders-- enter through 11th St.
- Check in stations will be set up at both entrances to distribute student name tags, collect cell phones, and share our new attendance codes
- Check in will begin at 8:00am
- Doors open at 8:15am
- Scholars are tardy at 8:31am
- Scholars dismiss at 12:30pm from the same entrance they use at arrival
- Grab and go breakfast and lunch will be provided





JOIN OUR COMMUNITY COUNCIL EXECUTIVE BOARD!

What is the Community Council?

The Community Council is made up of the entire Public Prep Community. Every family is part of the Community Council.

What is a Community Council Executive Board Member?

A Community Council Board Member is a family member/guardian who is elected to represent the entire Girls Prep or Boys Prep Community and represent the families throughout the year. It is made up of 3 family members.

What is the difference between the two?

The Community Council meets as an Executive Board, with the school leadership team and facilitates Community Council Meetings to the community to discuss events at the school and any concerns they may have. They present their ideas and desires for events and activities to the entire community during Community Council meetings.

Board Members meet to plan and implement activities that families can enjoy in order to facilitate a closer community. They listen to the community's ideas and concerns and present them to the school leadership team to implement them or try to find solutions.

Who can be on the Board?

Any family member/guardian who has the time and is willing to work with other families and the staff can be elected to the Board.

What does being on the Board entail?

Board Members meet at least once a month in person. Board members hold elected positions. Board members must be willing and flexible to meet, plan, participate in and attend all Community Council events as well as assist the school with other events. The Board collaborates with the staff very closely. All events and programs must receive the approval of school leadership team.

We are accepting Nominations for this year's board. If you are interested in serving on the Community Council ExecutiveBoard please read the descriptions for Board positions listed on the back. You may nominate yourself or another fellow parent for a position.

All are welcome to apply!

- September 19, 2022-September 23, 2022 Voting
- **September 30, 2022** Community Council Executive Board Member Announced.

EXECUTIVE BOARD ROLES

The Executive Board (E-Board) of the Community Council is the leadership team, responsible for operation and coordination of each Community Council. The following is a list of positions that can be included in a Community Council Executive Board, with the President position required for all boards. All E-board members are required to attend network and school leadership meetings, volunteer at select school events, and support in planning Community Council-led events and activities.

- PRESIDENT: The president is responsible for running Community Council meetings, logistics for events and fundraisers as well as administration of finances in coordination with the network and their school's Director of Operations. Supports the management of Facebook group, posts flyers approved by Student and Family Affairs Team (SFA), amplifies messages about events. Examples: ensures members of FB group are following guidelines (direct families to speak with leadership regarding individual inquiries).
- VICE PRESIDENT: Recruits families to volunteer at school events and supports student recruitment efforts in partnership with Public Prep. Identify community resources for families, and plan local community services opportunities. Examples: spreads the word about Community Council events, phone banks for new applicants, etc. Informing families of local giveaways, coordinating participation in Council Member's charity walk, etc.
- SECRETARY: Creates flyers approved by Student and Family Affairs Team (SFA), amplifies messages about events and takes notes at Community Council meetings and manages the write up for the Community Council section of the campus family newsletters.

As outlined in our Charter, one senior officer from all Public Prep Academies Pre-K through 8th grade school (GP LES, GP Bronx or BP Bronx) will be selected to serve a one-year term on the Board of Directors.
